I write following your FOI request dated 25.6.13 in which you request;

I would like to add to the FOI I submitted based on 'Top 30 sexual offenders' (or resubmit it if your constabulary was unable to respond to it).

Instead I would like the total number of arrests made in the constabulary catchment area since 2009 for the following offences:

- *Rape*
- *Sexual assault*
- *Administering a substance (drinks spiking)*
- *Trespass with intent to commit a sexual offence*
- *Sexual intercourse with a girl under the age of 16*
- *Abuse of trust through a sexual activity*
- *Sexual activity by a care worker*
- *Engaging in a sexual activity in the presence of a child*
- *Sexual grooming*
- *Sexual activity with a family member*
- *Abduction*
- *Indecent conduct towards a child*
- *Taking an indecent photograph of a child*
- *Causing or inciting child prostitution*
- *Procuring a woman by threats or false pretences*
- *Trafficking a person into the UK for sexual exploitation*
- *Exposure*
- *Voyeurism*

If it is possible to know who the most prolific offender for each of these offences (based on the number of arrests/charges/convictions) then I would like to add that too my request.

Finally, I would like to add one more request:

- *I would like the postcode (street address) that has experienced the most arrests based on prostitution since 2009.*

If you require any further clarifications, then please do not hesitate to contact me.

This request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Regarding your Freedom of Information request I can now inform you that I have completed my enquiries and that my reply on behalf of the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cleveland is as follows.
