## **Decision Required – Supporting Information**

Financial Implications: (Must include comments of the PCC's CFO where the decision has financial implications)

The financial position of the PCC assumes that £211k will be received from the DBS to fund the work undertaken within the Professional Standards department. The additional £15k will only be made available should this £211k original assumption in relation to income be over recovered by the £15k.

The DBS income regularly over achieves the budget by more than £15,000 requested on this bid. In 2011/12 DBS income over achieved by £49k against a £191k budget. In 2012/13 DBS income over achieved by £58.8k against a £211k budget. The £15,000 would cover the costs of the Diclosure Team's expenditure using the split £10k Overtime/NI and £5k General (Printing, Stationery, Subsistence etc). A breakdown of the split can be provided should the bid be successful. Costs incurred by the Disclosure Team have always been recovered through the DBS returns. The expenditure of the team is driven by the volume of disclosures received, if there is a high volume overtime needs to be worked which drives up the costs. However, as the overtime is claimed for as part of the monthly return, the income received will increase to the amount of the overtime worked. Therefore any increase in costs will be covered by an increase in income. Without this bid for income, this would become a significant overspend against the Professional Standards budget.
