Report of the Chief Constable to the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cleveland.

Procurement Report for the Provision of ICT hardware

1. Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek approval for Cleveland Police to purchase ICT hardware requirements from the collaborative NHSSBS ICT framework contract 'LINK IT'.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 That the report is noted.
- The Police and Crime Commissioner agrees to use the collaborative contract 'LINK IT' for the provision of ICT hardware until expiry of the framework agreement on 30th November 2016.

3. Background

- 3.1 Following a review of ICT spend as well as consultation with key stakeholders; it was evident that the ICT team required access to a supplier or framework agreement to ensure compliance with contract standing orders and to obtain value for money within their annual budgets when procuring ICT hardware such as desktop PC's, laptops, monitors and servers.
- 3.2 From looking at options within the marketplace and potential routes to market, it was evident that due to the volume requirements the force has for ICT hardware over the next 2 financial years, a sole tender exercise would not necessarily provide value for money or the most efficient route to market as it would target ICT resellers to bid for the contract rather than the manufacturer themselves due to low volume requirements.

- 3.3 Also, a sole tender exercise for ICT hardware wouldn't really be seen as best practice within the wider public sector procurement arena as the majority of public sector organisations either procure through framework agreements directly or collaborate ICT volumes together with the aim of targeting the manufacturer to bid directly.
- 3.4 It became apparent from further analysis on the current ICT marketplace and also from reviewing contract pricing from the previous time the force contracted direct with Hewlett Packard, that a collaborative framework agreement which allowed purchasing hardware direct from the manufacturer would offer the most efficient, compliant and cost effective route of procuring ICT hardware.
- 3.5 Several framework agreements were reviewed; however the agreements mainly provided direct access to large ICT re-seller organisations that provided competitive pricing on the hardware however the pricing did include an added margin on the products from the re-seller.
- During a meeting with the NHSSBS procurement team to look at potential collaboration opportunities across a number of key spend areas, it became apparent that there was an ICT framework agreement set up by NHSSBS that would be immediately accessible to Cleveland Police and would provide economies of scale within the volume of ICT hardware required.
- 3.7 The framework agreement titled 'LINK IT' is available to use until 30th November 2016 and provides access to procure from the ICT manufacturers direct rather than through ICT re-sellers, this provides a significant cost saving overall as there are no added on margins on any of the ICT hardware products.
- 3.8 A meeting was held with the ICT team to review the 'LINK IT' framework agreement and it was agreed that the framework would provide immediate support to the ICT team in delivering their annual capital and revenue replenishment programme for key ICT hardware.
- 3.9 Following approval to use the agreement, Cleveland Police can access the framework agreement immediately and procure ICT hardware until 30th November 2016.
- 3.10 The use of the NHSSBS 'LINK IT' framework agreement would ensure full compliance with contract standing orders and most importantly deliver value for money for Cleveland Police.

4. Implications

4.1 Finance

The table below shows an example of the pricing difference of several categories of ICT hardware between procuring through the NHSSBS framework and procuring directly from an ICT re-seller.

Category of hardware	Pricing NHSSBS Framework	Pricing ICT Reseller	Pricing difference
Desktop	£289.09	£385.00	-£95.91
