<p>Neighbourhood Crime - How can the force demonstrate they are effectively meeting the needs of victims and responding effectively? (to include criminal damage, burglary, shoplifting, anti-social behaviour)</p> <p>Resolution without Deployment How confident are the Force that they are providing a good service for those people who report crime where it is resolved without deployment?</p> <p>The CAAF review mentions that both victims and members of the public benefit as resources are allocated proportionately and that it doesn't give victims false hope, as it's explained why a crime is not appropriate for further investigation. What does the Force understand about the public's view on this practice?</p> <p>Has any consideration been given to the benefits of providing an online face-to-face 'consultation' for people reporting crime?</p>
