The Vacancy

We are looking for two new members of the **Independent Audit Committee** for the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and the Chief Constable of Cleveland Police.

The vacancies, which have arisen because existing members have reached their maximum term of service, are for an initial period of four years.

The Audit Committee meets at least four times a year. Members of the OPCC and Cleveland Police executive must attend every meeting.

It is made up of five members, who are completely independent of the OPCC and Cleveland Police.

The Role

Members advise Cleveland PCC and Chief Constable on good governance. As a result, they play a key role in improving public trust and confidence in how both the OPCC and Cleveland Police are run.

The committee also helps the PCC in their statutory responsibility to hold Cleveland Police to account.

The applicant

Applicants must be:

- Independent of the PCC, Cleveland Police and Crime Panel and the Chief Constable
- Not employed by the Police or any of its partner organisations.
- Able to demonstrate experience and knowledge of corporate governance

Members receive an annual allowance of £1,500, with the expectation that they will spend about five to seven days per year working in the role.
